Title: Intro to Culinary Arts

Grades: 9 - 12

Graduation Requirement: Elective

Course Description: Intro to Culinary Arts is a one-semester Career and Technical Education designed to prepare students for entry level employment in the food service industry as well as for continuing education in Culinary Arts. The competencies focus on identifying and exploring the individual careers within the food service industry. Units of study include food and beverage production and preparation, and food safety and sanitation, dietetics and nutrition services, diverse cuisines and service styles, and current trends. Students will be required to pass the national ServSafe certification at completion of course.

Title: History of Mexico

Grades: 9 - 12

Graduation Requirement: Elective

Meets A-G: N/A Pre-requisite: None Replaces: N/A

Course Description: We share almost 2,000 miles of border with Mexico, and nearly eight million Mexicans live in the United States, yet many of us learn next to nothing about this fascinating country's history. This course attempts to address this gap in our education system by providing an in-depth look at Mexican history, with an emphasis on the period from independence to the present. This course surveys the political, social cultural, and economic history of Mexico from Pre-Columbian times to the present. Discussion of major epochs of Mexican history will focus on the influence of various cultural groups in shaping modern Mexico.
